A Very Special Event. Memories of Hiroshima and Nagasaki exhibition Brisbane Square Library 1st March-30thApril

"Memories of Hiroshima and Nagasaki -a quest for Peace"

This 2 month long exhibition offers and insight into the tragic events in Hiroshima and Nagasaki in 1945. The exhibition offers a series of unique posters and info panels along with 6 unique artifacts from the bombed cities. A series of audio-visual presentations will also provide moving testimony to the event and the message of world peace strongly promoted in each city.

A very special part of the exhibition will be the personal account of the events by Hiroshima survivor **Mr Keijiro Matsushima who will travel to Brisbane for just 6 days.** His account provides a wonderful historical context. Students will also be able to take part in a **PEACE CRANE MISSION** to provide Peace Cranes to be taken to Hiroshima in commemoration of the August 6th bombing. The cranes will be part of the 2013 ceremony in Hiroshima city.

Of additional interest at the exhibition will be the first viewing of a collection of photos and artifacts belonging to **Mr Dan Crane who was a member of the British Commonwealth Occupation Forces** sent to Japan soon after the events of August 6th and 9th 1945. This group of soldiers and their experiences provide an interesting contrast to that of Keijiro Matsushima.
